

Summer Internship Programme 2010

JUSTICE, one of the leading UK human rights and law reform organisations, takes between 2 to 3 policy interns each year on our summer internship programme. Summer interns undertake legal research in one of JUSTICE's main areas of policy work: human rights, criminal justice, and EU law. For this reason we are now seeking applications from **law graduates only**. This includes people who expect to have completed a law degree or conversion course by the time they start their internship. In exceptional cases, we will consider applications from non-law graduates who can demonstrate in their application that they have relevant knowledge/ experience equivalent to a degree.

JUSTICE interns gain the opportunity to develop skills and experience of working on important areas of legal policy at a national level as well as the chance to be part of a small, friendly and committed staff.

Our summer internship programme will run between June and September 2010. Successful applicants must commit to working in our central London office for a minimum of 4 days per week, between 10am - 5pm for at least 6 weeks during that period. We pay a small weekly stipend to cover lunch and travel expenses within London, together with approved incidental expenses. JUSTICE's internship programme is governed by equal opportunities principles.

To be considered for a summer internship please email a copy of your CV to Hayley Smith (https://nxith@justice.org.uk) together with a brief covering letter explaining your interest in JUSTICE and the internship programme and indicating your experience, skills and availability over the summer.

It would also be helpful if you indicated the particular area of our policy work you are interested in as this year internships will be offered in Criminal Justice, Human Rights or EU Justice and Home Affairs (with an emphasis on criminal justice).

The closing date for applications for this summer is Friday 7 May 2010.

Short-listed candidates will be invited for interview in late May.
